

## **National Commission for Protection of Child Rights**

**Subject: Inviting proposals for Awards from children (6-14 years and 15-18 years) for promoting child rights through innovative techniques/methods/practices**

Children represent more than one-third of the world's population and have the right to survive, live and grow up in a conducive environment with dignity. Sustainable development starts with safe, healthy and well-educated children. The role of science, technology and innovation in promoting the cause of child rights is quite significant as envisaged in the Sustainable Development Goals-2030. In fact, various efforts have already been made by the Government, civil societies and other key players for promoting the cause of rights of children are laudable. However there is need to promote and encourage such efforts when initiated and undertaken by children themselves and also to document best practices for replicating them elsewhere where they are more needed.

### **2. NCPCR invites entries for awards:**

With the above background, NCPCR invites entries from children who have undertaken innovative work that has directly or indirectly promoted child rights and good practices influencing the lives of children/society. The Awards would be handed over to the awardees during the NCPCR's Foundation Day, i.e. on **05<sup>th</sup> March 2018**. The last date for receipt of entries is **15<sup>th</sup> Jan 2018**. Format for submitting the entry is **annexed**.

### **3. Eligibility Criteria:**


- (a) Innovations that have brought positive changes influencing the lives of children and have visibly added advantage over existing practices;
- (b) Innovations that are user friendly and have the potential to be replicated and up-scaled;
- (c) Innovations that have promoted the rights and safety of children;
- (d) Innovations undertaken during the calendar years 2016 and 2017.

### **4. Who can Apply:**

The Awards are open to individual children or a group of children in the age groups of **6-14 years and 15-18 years**.

### **5. Number of Awards:**

In each category of age-group, 25 top entries will be awarded with a certificate & Rs 10,000/- each. The awardees would be required to come to New Delhi to receive awards. In case of an entry by a group of children the award will be received by the team leader. The Award money will be given through cheque in the name of the applicant/team leader.




**6. Screening & Selection Committee:**

A Screening Committee shall be constituted by NCPCR to scrutinize and short list the entries. The Commission reserves the right to accept or reject any entry.


