Working Report

INTRODUCTION

The Commission conducted its 33rd Bench/Camp in Kadapa District which is situated in Andhra Pradesh. The programme was organised on 4th October 2019. The Bench/Camp consisted of Dr. R.G. Anand, Honorable Member of National Commission for the Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR), Kum. G. Hymavathi, Chairperson and 2 Members of Andhra Pradesh State Commission for the Protection of Child Rights (APSCPCR); Sh. C. Hari Kiran, District Collector, Kadapa; B. Siva Reddy, Joint Collector II, Kadapa; S. Praveen Kumar, DLSA, Kadapa; B. Lakshmi Narayana, Additional S.P, Kadapa; Smt. A. Padmaja, Project Director, DW& CDA, Kadapa.



The key highlights of the Bench/Camp were:-

- The Bench/Camp received 118 complaints from the district and all 118 complaints were heard on the same day.
- The Bench/Camp did not receive any complaint from the District Authorities present during the bench.
- The Nodal Officers from all the districts participated and provided their valuable support to the Bench/Camp.
- The Commission received complaints from Child line and had received individual representations during the NGO meet. The representations received from the NGO during the meeting prior to the day of bench were generic in nature and did not provide any particular child

rights complaint.

- Although the turnout of number of NGOs present during the meeting was substantial, no complaint from any NGO was brought before the bench on 4.10.2019.
- The complaints received by the Commission were mostly concerned with POCSO Compensation, infrastructure in schools and disease related compensation/certificates.
- A few generic cases of presence of Child Labor in the district were also received but despite seemingly rampant condition of child labor in the district no particular complaints were received.

THE SITTING OF THE BENCH/CAMP

NON GOVERNMENTAL ORGANISATION (Ngo) Consultation Meet

The National Commission for the Protection of Child Rights conducted an NGO Consultation meet on 2nd October 2019. The meeting was organized at District Collectorate Office in Kadapa. The NCPCR team was led by Ms. Anshu Sharma, Consultant (Education) along with Mr. Rajesh (Admin.Assistant); Mr.Ajish I.R, Consultant (JJ/QRC) and Ms. Toko Dumie, Consultant (Child Labour). The NCPCR team along with Kumari G. Hymavathi, Chairperson and 2 members of Andhra Pradesh State Commission for the Protection of Child Rights (APSCPCR); B. Siva Reddy, Joint Colletor II, Kadapa and Smt. A. Padmaja, Project Director, DW&CDA, Kadapa District chaired the Consultation meet. During the meeting, the NCPCR team informed the NGO's about the objective and purpose of constituting a National Bench/Camp related to child rights violations in the district. The team also informed the respective NGO's about the roles and responsibilities of the Commission and work done by the Commission all over the years in protecting and preserving the rights of children. Out of 109 NGO's registered under NITI Darpan portal around 70 NGO's have participated in this meeting. The Commission informed the NGO's about the objective of National Bench/Camp and asked them to attend the meeting to bring complaint grid or complainants highlighting the child rights violation from there district on the day of the sitting of National Bench.

Key Highlights from the Ngo-Meeting

- Around 70 NGO's participated in the meeting.
- Around 10 NGO's agreed to volunteer in the Bench conducted by the National Commission to help function it smoothly and efficiently.
- Representations of the NGO's received were found to be generic in nature.

- NGO's highlighted the issue of eve teasing, child marriage, child labor and rehabilitation of rescued children but no particular complaint/representation was made.

INSPECTION VISITS

Inspection of Institutions Related to Child Welfare

The Officials of NCPCR conducted a one day inspection visit to Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences of Kadapa District. NCPCR Team was accompanied by the Chairperson and members, Andhra Pradesh State Commission for Protection of Child Rights. The objective of these inspections was to review the performance and standards of the facilities provided to the children and simultaneously take Suo-Moto cognizance on the matters pertaining to child rights violations in these institutes.

Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences (RIMS)

The NCPCR team along with the Chairperson and members of APSCPCR conducted an inspection at RIMS in Kadapa district on 3rd October 2019 to examine the facilities provided to the children.

Observation:

- Shortage of doctors in the hospital
- Shortage of beds in the pediatric ward
- Shortage of oxygen masks and cylinders
- The washrooms in the hospitals were unhygienic

Meeting with District Administration, Kadapa on 03.10.2019.

The team conducted a meeting with District Collector, Kadapa; Joint Collector, Kadapa; Chairperson & Members of ASCPCR; Member of DLSA, SP Kadapa & Nodal Officer, PD CDA, Departmental Officers such as WCD, Labour, PRO, DCPO, etc. NCPCR's team took feedback on the preparation done till date. The Collector informed that a meeting with SCPCR and officers had already been conducted before the arrival of NCPCR team and all the officers have been directed to attend the bench being held on 04.10.2019. NCPCR team explained the procedure of Camp and sample note sheet to be filled during the bench was also

shown to the officers present to make the proceedings of the bench smooth. The collector also helped in the explanation of the process during bench and what role departments had to play during the sitting of bench. Further, explained on how a complaint to be dealt during the bench.

ON THE DAY OF THE SITTING OF THE BENCH/CAMP

The Commission conducted its National Bench/Camp at Kadapa district in Andhra Pradesh. The Bench/Camp was organized on 04th October 2019. The bench/Camp consisted of Dr. R.G. Anand, Honorable Member of National Commission for the Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR), Shri Hair Kiran, Collector Kadapa; Kum. G. Hymavathi, Chairperson ASCPCR, Members ASCPCR, Smt. A. Padmaja, Project Director, DW&CDA; Joint Director, Kadapa; Member DLSA and SP Kadapa. In total the bench/camp received 118 complaints- All the complaints were head during the bench and orders were passed.

AREA WISE COMPLAINTS

Complaints are segregated based on the 6 areas that come under section 3 of CPC Act, 2005. The highest number of cases, that is, 41 cases was registered under Juvenile Justice, 28 Cases under Education, 20 under Health, 24 cases were registered under POCSO cases, 1 case under Child psychology, 2 under child labour and some others .

Complaint Analysis According to NITI AAYOG INDICATORS

The National Bench of NCPCR is being conducted in those districts which are declared 'aspirational' by NITI Aayog. The NITI Aayog analysed these districts based on 49 indicators segregated in five sectors- Health, Education, Agriculture & Water Resources, Financial Inclusion and Basic Infrastructure. NCPCR has a mandate to take complaints in the matters related to child rights violations. Therefore, the commission has placed its focus on three key sectors- Education & Nutrition Focusing on the Facilities provided to children.

CONCLUSION

The National Bench was conducted successfully in Kadapa, Andhra Pradesh. NCPCR registered and passed orders on all the 118 complaints received during the sitting of the bench/camp. Although, turnout rate of NGOs who attended the meeting prior to the bench was substantial and very promising, but no complaint was brought by any NGO during the sitting of the bench. While complete awareness was done by the District Administration, no major response was received during the bench in terms of complaints even though Kadapa as a district seems to possess many child rights violations. Part of the responsibility of lack of complaints could be sided to the fact that information and appropriate knowledge did not reach to the most remote areas of the district.

A small part of tribal population also resides in the district but no response could be generated from any tribal area. No complaint/data or information reached the bench related to tribal welfare; lack in implementation of schemes; problems faced by the general population or related to migrants residing in the District. Similar to other districts in South India, Kadapa has also been plagued with social challenges like Child Marriage, Child Labour, lack of medication etc. Child Line could be accounted for a very forthcoming response during the bench and in bringing the complaints in Kadapa whereas NGO and official support needs to be scrutinized.
