





# **CAMP/BENCH REPORT**

Working Report

#### **INTRODUCTION**

The National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) conducted its Camp in Ramgarh District which is situated in Jharkhand. The programme was organised on 20th September 2019. The Camp consisted of the Shri Priyank Kanoongo, Honorable Chairperson of National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) along with Smt. Sandeep Singli, Deputy Commissioner. The Camp at Ramgarh District received an overwhelming response from various stakeholders involved in making this programme a success.

### The key highlights of the National Bench were as follow:

- The Camp received 372 complaints from various districts and passed orders on complaints on the same day.
- The respective NGO's front various districts helped in mobilizing people on the day of the sitting of the bench.



#### **Before the Sitting of Bench**

#### NON GOVERNMENTAL ORGANISATION (NGOs) Meet

Before the sitting of the Camp, National Commission for Protection of Child Rights held a consultation meeting with the NGO's on 19" September 2019. Mr. Rakesh Prajapati, Consultant (Public Relation)

NCPCR, NCPCR, Ms. Mahima Lal Consultant (Education), Bhawna Sharma, Consultant (Juvenile Justice) and Mr. Brijesh (DEO) chaired the consultation meeting. In that session, NCPCR team informed the respected NGO's about the roles and responsibilities of NCPCR and the objective of conducting the National Camp. NCPCR team also informed the NGO's about their responsibility in this whole process and requested them to bring complaints related to child rights violation on the day of the sitting of the bench from their districts.

## ON THE DAY OF THE SITTING OF THE BENCH

The Commission conducted its National bench/camp at Ramgarh district in Jharkhand. The Bench/Camp was organised on 20th September 2019. The bench/camp consisted of Shri. Priyank Kanoongo, Chairperson of National Commission for the Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR), and Additional Deputy Commissioner of Ramgarh District. In total the bench/camp received 372 complaints- 200 Complaints heard by the bench/camp. Below the information on the total number of cases received during the sitting of the bench/camp.

Apart from the Individual complaints, several NGO's, and DCPU from district Ramgarh presented the cases of child rights violation to the Camp. The complainants representing different institutes or individuals helped the commission in reaching to the children who could not present their cases on the day of the sitting of the Camp. The complaints were related to the issue of children with disabilities in term of pension and disability certificate, Medical treatment, Scholarships related with financial assistance, inadequate infrastructure school, Admission in schools, Proper Education, Closing of Mid-Day Meal etc. in Ramgarh Camp. 3 NGO's brought complaints before and During the Bench.

## **Area Wise Complaints Under (CPCR Act, 2005)**

The same complaints were segregated based on the 6 areas that come under section 3 of CPCR Act, 2005. The highest number of cases that is, 216 were registered under Juvenile Justice, 38 cases were registered under Education, 2 under POCSO, 06 cases Under Child Labour,110 under Child Health category which requires a holistic approach.
